IF ELECTED TO REPRESENT THE PEOPLE OF THE CLARINDA DISTRICT, HERE ARE SOME OF MY COMMITMENTS FOR THIS COMMUNITY.

1. I will donate 15% of my annual income for the first year. The second year, it will increase to 20%. The third year it will increase to 25% and the fourth year, it will increase to 30%, to the after-school program, such as sports competitions. I would like to see young kids be more active in sports and proud of their school.

2. I will organise quarterly Trivia nights for our senior citizens to have a great night. The prizes and funds will be supported by local businesses. The events are for our senior citizens, but it would not need to be restricted to older people, as I would like to see all ages come and enjoy the night.

3. I will organise bi-annual meetings with the community to listen to all the questions, concerns and new ideas in order to understand what government policies need to be updated and what needs to be raised at Parliament.

1. NO TRAIN YARD:

I stand with the people of the Clarinda District in opposing the Train Yard which does not belong in the heart of the Clarinda District. I will petition and lead the people of the Clarinda District in voicing opposition to this eco-unfriendly plan. Working together, we can move the train yard out and allow this site to be transformed into a permanent nature reserve.

2. UNEMPLOYMENT:

I believe an elected candidate to Clarinda District should be proactive with local businesses, and there are opportunities for businesses to take on local unemployed young adults with the support of the State Government. I will actively lobby the State Government to implement a program where local businesses and/or agencies are incentivised to train and employ young people in the Clarinda District.

3. EDUCATION:

I will ask the State Government to build a technical school in the Clarinda District. Not every young person is academic. Some prefer going to a technical school where they can learn a hands-on profession at a younger age. Such a school would guide them on their career path and help them become successful in the future. The technical school I am proposing allows young people to start from year 7, so by the time they have completed year 10, they have gained a solid background in the career path that they have chosen to follow for their future.
